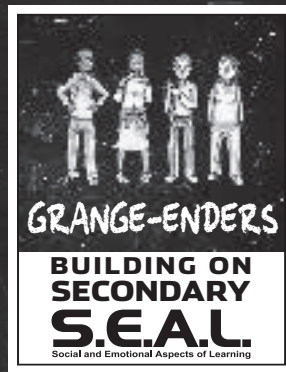

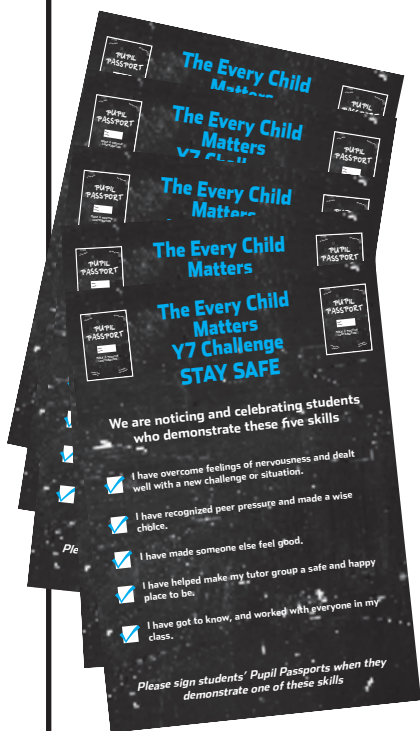
An Every Child Matters Pupil Passport*

The passport contains five tasks for pupils to complete for each Y7 Theme (organized by ECM outcome) – each task must be signed off by an adult in school. Encourages pupils and adults to remember, acknowledge and celebrate the practical applications of SEAL right across the curriculum. Run a Y7 ECM Challenge - who can get all 25 tasks signed off during Y7?



ECM Challenge posters*

Display eye-catching A3 ECM posters in every classroom to focus adults and pupils on the social, emotional and behavioural skills focused on in each Y7 and ECM Theme, as recommended by the Secondary SEAL Strategy. Posters remind all school personnel (yes, admin and support staff too!) of the five tasks in the Pupil Passport and remind adults across the curriculum to look out for the practical application of SEAL and to sign pupils' Passports. The posters ensure a consistent focus for recognising and celebrating the practical application of SEAL skills across the curriculum in a practical and 'do-able' way.

The extension activities that form the diary pages offer an opportunity to reinforce and personalise learning, encourage reflection and embed SEAL learning.

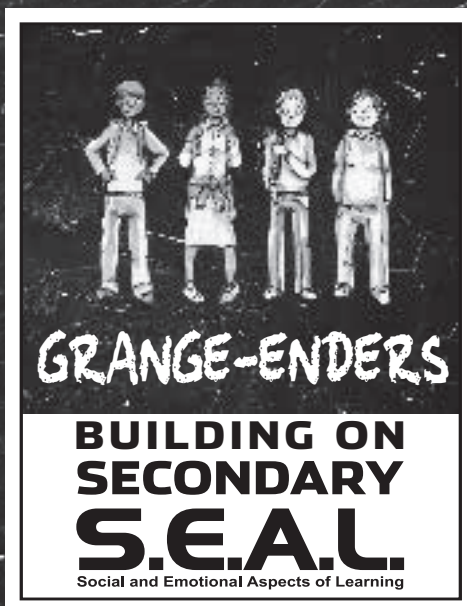
